Stronger is a fun and faith-filled program where young people get together and celebrate their faith in Jesus Christ with one another. The program was founded in the Sandhurst Diocese in 2008 by the late Bishop of Sandhurst, Bishop Joseph Grech, and Fr Rob Galea. The mission of Stronger is to see: "Young people encountering Jesus Christ and His Church, becoming stronger to live as disciples who impact the world."

Stronger has a number of gatherings each year including:

Stronger Retreat:

The Stronger Retreat is a dynamic Catholic retreat held annually over a weekend in the Sandhurst Diocese for young people aged 16-26.

Stronger Rallies:

The Stronger Rallies currently attract about 150 young people for each event and are held in different locations around the Sandhurst Diocese about four times a year to provide secondary school students and young adults with the opportunity to gather to celebrate their faith through music, worship, talks and discussion.

D Groups:

The purpose of Stronger D (Discipleship) Groups is to build strong, faithful and informed disciples of Jesus Christ in the Church. The D Groups challenge young people to think about opinions, learn about themselves, and grow in their faith. D Groups are held in parishes across the Sandhurst Diocese.

Stronger L!VE:

Is open to young adults and takes place in pubs across the Diocese. A typical Stronger

Live event gathers young people together for good fellowship, live music from a local band and engaging guest speakers who discuss faith based topics that are relevant to young people.

Outreach:
