



Joined the Orders of Preachers in 1949 as a Dominican brother
Appointed to Pacific Island Missions to skipper Salve Regina, mission
ship to serve the people of the Solomon Islands delivering supplies
Ordained a priest on 12 July 1980


Served as Parish Priest in parishes in Sydney, Canberra and Brisbane Joined the Diocese of Sandhurst just before Christmas in 2000 Appointed to Wodonga parish 2001-2012

Retired to St Kilian's Parish in Bendigo in 2012 and continued to serve at St Kilian's and Inglewood parishes
Died on Sunday 29 August 2021 aged 94.

They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither. In all that they do, they prosper. Father Paul was a member of the Dominican Order for approximately 50 years, serving as captain on the mission boat 'Salve Regina' in the Solomon Islands and in Dominican Parishes in Australia.

He subsequently spent 21 years as a Priest of the Diocese of Sandhurst serving in the Parishes of Wodonga and St. Kilian's with distinction.
